This year, New Beginnings continued to advance our mission of supporting survivors, building awareness, and mobilizing the community to end domestic violence, even as the needs around us became more complex and opposition grew louder. In 2025, we reached over 16,800 survivors and families across all services, expanded our reach in the Social Change program with a middle school boys' group, and distributed over \$762,000 of financial assistance. We also deepened our commitment to housing stability, meaningful access to 24/7 support, and economic justice, investing in long term solutions that will shape our region for years to come. Hope Network

Our Hope Network is a community of donors who give each month to support survivors through our services. This strong, passionate community understands that recurring support is critical for organizational stability and future planning, so survivors can continue to receive the best services possible to meet their needs.

For this community, we hope to provide convenience in their giving with no hassle automated monthly donations, and to create a sense of community and knowing they are part of the work to end domestic violence. We are forever grateful for our Hope Network community.



*In 2025, we had 60 Hope Network donors who raised more than **\$44,000** with their recurring giving plans.*

Home Safe

Home Safe is New Beginnings' housing solution program providing people who are experiencing domestic violence with temporary housing, advocacy, and services to move clients into permanent housing.

In 2025, Home Safe prioritized building community for survivors living in confidential shelter — where visitors aren't permitted and isolation can deepen trauma. In response to what survivors told us they needed most, we hosted celebrations for International Women's Day, Halloween, and an art event that quickly became a favorite. Alongside this, our team navigated significant barriers for families, including high rental arrears and complex housing challenges, securing stability for survivors who needed it most.

Community Advocacy Program (CAP)

New Beginnings offers one-on-one advocacy to survivors of intimate partner violence and facilitates individualized services tailored to what each survivor and their family needs. CAP continues to provide critical support to survivors in the community through its Rapid Rehousing, Legal Advocacy programs, Survivor Advocacy and Mental Health Counseling.

Through Rapid Rehousing, we assist survivors and their families in securing and maintaining safe, stable housing, helping them build a foundation for long-term safety and independence.

Our Legal Advocacy program continues to support survivors facing a wide range of legal challenges related to intimate partner domestic violence. In addition, CAP facilitates the weekly King County Bar Association (KCBA) Domestic Violence Family Law Clinic, partnering with volunteer family law attorneys to provide survivors with access to legal guidance, resources, and support as they navigate family law matters.

Together, these programs have strengthened survivors' access to safety, housing stability, and legal protections, contributing to improved outcomes for individuals and families impacted by domestic violence.

Federal housing funding continues to evolve, requiring domestic violence organizations to thoughtfully adapt how housing programs are designed and funded. New Beginnings remains committed to maximizing available resources and providing flexible, survivor-centered housing options that help survivors achieve safety, stability, and long-term housing success.

Housing, Legal, Financial Assistance, Emotional Support, and Safety Planning

DVHopeline

The DVHopeline is a free, safe and confidential domestic violence advocacy support for any person, from any community, of any age, gender, or ability. This critical program walks alongside survivors as they navigate domestic violence by providing compassionate, trauma-informed advocacy, empowering informed decision-making, and increasing access to safety, support, and community resources.

One of the major advocacy needs that are uplifted from contacts is legal advocacy, specifically Domestic Violence Protection Orders (DVPOs). All DVHL advocates can walk alongside contacts with understanding and navigating this civil process.

One contact shared during an interaction with a DVHL advocate, “Having you guide me through the protection order was essential to me and my children’s safety and is a turning point that will allow us to break free and heal.”

Social Change

Our Social Change program offers a variety of services that aim to create awareness of and prevent future domestic violence. We educate and facilitate conversations about healthy relationships with survivors, their families, and the larger community.

This year, we continued delivering our 12-session All Gender Crushin’ It healthy relationships curriculum across 10 partner schools while expanding our programming. With support from a male practicum student from the UW School of Social Work, we piloted tailored Crushin’ It groups for boys at Jane Addams and Washington Middle Schools.

We also launched a Peer Relationship Educator group at Nathan Hale High School, where students co-facilitated teen dating violence prevention activities and created an educational video. In addition, our Social Change team led several health class presentations, and we trained school counselors and service providers on teen dating violence prevention and curriculum facilitation.

*In 2025, Social Change programs reached **637 youth** and **82 adults** with prevention programming.*

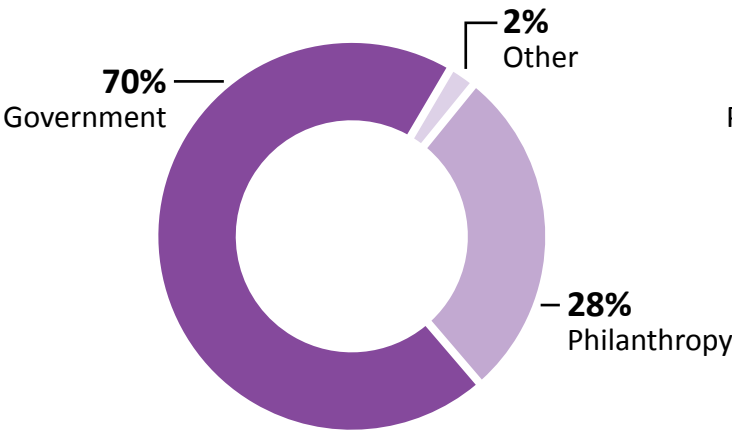

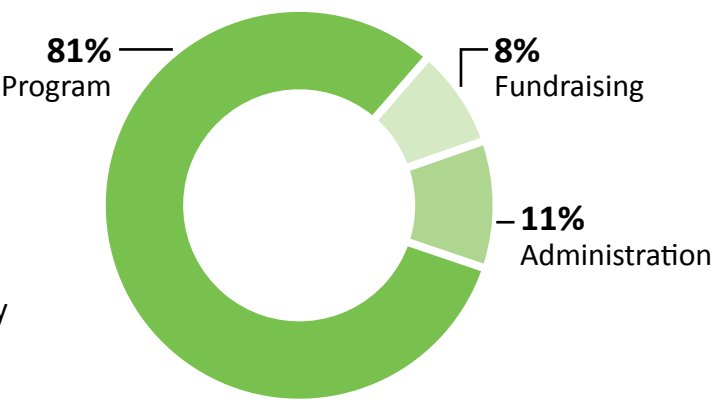

REVENUE



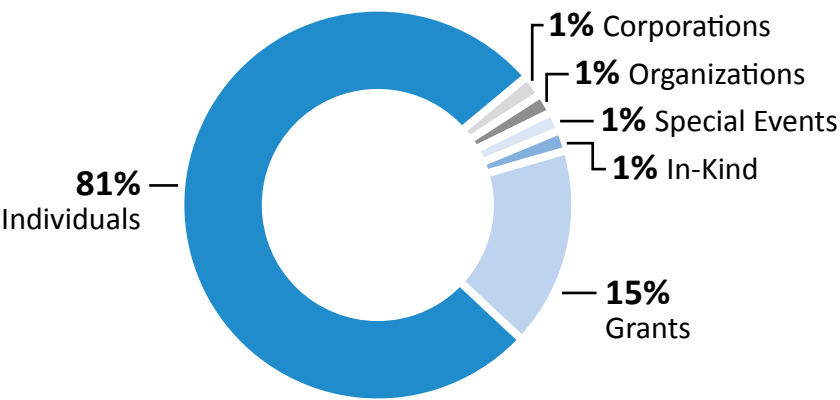
TOTAL = \$7.86M
